Ivy Whitlatch – Alexandria Archaeological Commission (AAC)

- Jones Point Lighthouse The amendment to the Net Benefits Agreement was fully executed by the City on June 9. A copy of the agreement was provided to the National Park Service (NPS). NPS representatives stated they would keep the City in the loop on the project status.

Standing Committee Reports:

Alexandria Community Remembrance Project (ACRP) – Nigel Mease

• The August 8th Remembrance of Benjamin Thomas is being planned and will be held at Shiloh Baptist Church with special guest speaker Steven Hahn (historian and Pulitzer Prize winner) at 6:30 p.m.

City Hall and Market Square Redesign – John Patrick, Gail Rothrock

- The BAR meeting with the concept review was held. The City is reluctant to make substantial changes to the glass on the upper levels. Changes were made by the designers to the Market Square entrance, including Federal Period architectural elements and motifs. Still interested in understanding the interior lighting in the glass stairwells located in the hyphens.
- The City is beginning a new survey, number 5, to engage the public about the interpretation of City Hall and Market Square.

Board of Architectural Review (BAR) Update: Bill Conkey

910 King Street

• At the last BAR hearing, the Board considered the proposed improvements to 910 King Street after accepting a request for deferral from the applicant at the first hearing. After discussing the design revisions, Board members were not supportive of the modifications and the applicant again asked for a deferral in order to further modify the design. The case will be returning to the Board for a third time tomorrow evening with a simplified proposal. In this submission, the applicant is only requesting a C of A for the proposed roof deck with a glass railing and to infill three windows on the west elevation.

802-808 N Washington Street

• The developer for the proposed multi-unit development at 802-808 N Washington Street will be returning to the Board for a Certificate of Appropriateness at the BAR hearing tomorrow evening. This is the site of the previously approved hotel where construction was stopped just as the below grade parking garage was being finished. A new developer has purchased the property and will be converting the project to a multi-unit residential

development. The applicant has revised the design based on comments from the Board at a previous hearing.

426 South Lee Street

• The owner of 426 South Lee Street is proposing to build a one-story addition at the rear of their house. The addition is simple in design and will be visible from the nearby Windmill Hill Park.

Updates to the design guidelines for the Parker Gray District will also be submitted to the BAR at tomorrow night's meeting. The changes are not policy related.
