- Meeting held at City Hall, Sister Cities room; called to order at approximately ~7:10 pm
- Attendance

- May'24 minutes: Eric motioned, James seconded to approve minutes with one minor revision. Unanimously approved.
- Old Business
 - o Eric led discussion of committee's participation in Alexandria's D-Day event. Erin offered to pull together some ideas for a general flyer about the committee's activities to use for future events. Possible swag items were also discussed.
 - o Eric will confirm date for Dr. Jimmy McClellan's history lecture in November as a part of Alexandria's anniversary celebration.
 - o Eric reported that Paul is continuing to pursue bringing Dundee tapestries exhibit to Alexandria.
 - o David led discussion of committee's sponsored outing to upcoming US-Scotland Rugby match in Washington (Audi Field) on July 12.

- New Business
 - O Diana reported on her success in connecting the Alexandria Library to its counterpart in Helsingborg. They discussed various options on ways to interact. The first step will be to set up a trans-Atlantic book club (similar to one between the Alexandria and Dundee libraries). The first meeting is tentatively scheduled for September. The Helsingborg Library also expressed interest in exploring a future video project which would be a virtual tour guide between the two cities.

 - o Discussed ways to interact more with students, including possibility of sponsoring a presentation by one or more Alexandria students who are attending college in Scotland. Committee also discussed possibility of recruiting a student liaison to the Sister Cities Committee to enhance facilitation of educational outreach activities.
 - Dale suggested that the committee should explore the possibility of leveraging state-collected tourism data to help direct some future committee-sponsored activities.
