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## Foreword

The Alexandria Archaeology Publications series is composed of papers on various aspects of research conducted under the auspices of Alexandria Archaeology, a division of the Office of Historic Alexandria, City of Alexandria, Virginia. The authors include professional staff members, university students and Alexandria Archaeology volunteers. Editing of the papers has been kept to a minimum. It should be understood that the papers vary in tone and level of technicality, since they were originally directed toward many different audiences.

One of the joys of doing historical archaeology is the interplay between documentary information and archaeological evidence. Both data sets complement one another, even if each are missing the whole picture of the past. In the case of cemetery studies, the research is supplemented by gravestone inscriptions and locations.

Lee DeRossi began her documentary project to transcribe the inscriptions on the stones and note their locations. She was greatly assisted by the previous transcription made by Carrie W. Avery in 1923, especially since nine gravestones were missing by the time of Lee's work in 1985. Since it was obvious that more people were buried in the Christ Church cemetery than the few remaining stones indicated, Lee examined the Vestry Records for recorded burials. She found information regarding 413 burials between 1787 and 1796, but far more burials would have occurred during other years. Our archaeological excavations determined the existing placement location of the gravestones was not congruent with the graves. Thus, we could not identify the burials with particular individuals. Lee's listing of individuals in this publication is our only way of knowing who was buried in the Christ Church Cemetery.

We are pleased to offer the papers within this series and in so doing are opening our "manuscripts on file" - including professional conference papers, background documentary studies, student course papers, and volunteer research papers - to professionals and public alike.

## Preface

This study was made in preparation for excavation of Christ Church Yard by Alexandria Archaeology in anticipation of construction activities on this property. Beginning at the northeast corner of the Christ Church Yard (Washington and Cameron Streets) gravestones in place as of August, 1985 were enumerated. Included in this compilation are the geographical and alphabetical lists of names on stones (Tables 1 and 2) and a corresponding plat revealing location in the Church Yard (Figure 1). Some stones were not readable or were broken. Appropriate indications are made of these problems. Also included are gravestone inscriptions which were copied in 1923 by Carrie Avery (Appendix 1). Nine of these inscribed stones have not been located in 1985 (Table 1).

To develop this information a comparison was made with the Christ Church Yard list of stones<sup>1</sup> and "Record of Burial Permits, Christ Church Yard 1787-1796"<sup>2</sup>. Further review of the Christ Church Vestry Records from 1765 to 1907 (on Microfilm at the Lloyd House, Alexandria)<sup>3</sup> & <sup>4</sup> revealed data on burials and burial policy from 1766-1785 and the building of Christ Church (Appendix II). Only nine individual burials were recorded in these years (Appendix III).

The "Records of Burial Permits" from November 1787 through December 8, 1796 (Appendix IV) reflects 413 burials in the Christ Church Yard. However, there were only 17 stones found in 1985

that correspond with names on this permit list (Table 1). Therefore, at least 396 graves are not presently marked by stones. In addition, there are no burial records for twelve years between 1766 and 1809 which at the burial rate from 1788 to 1796 (see Table 3) would suggest that another 540 graves may exist in Christ Church Yard.

A tabulation of the same burial permits reveals a majority of children deaths (174) from 1788 through 1794, closely followed by a preponderance of male deaths (130) during the years through 1796 (Table 3). The words "stranger," "poor" and "French Emigrant" have been included in this table under "Other."

In analyzing the Record of Burial Permits, I found on page 41 the word "Omitted" for six persons from October 19 through November 2, 1793. While I included these burials, I wonder! (Four of the names are similar to previous burials beginning July 1, 1791 through July 20, 1793.) Could these bodies have been removed ("omitted") to make room for the church building landscaping, or was it a recording error?

On June 24, 1794, the entry "the bodies of Mrs. Crowe, Mrs. Galahan, Mrs. Fulton & Mrs. Butts" for "six shillings" is shown in the burial permits (Appendix IV). Only Mrs. Crowe's gravestone (Table 2, #22, 35) remains and there is no mention of the other persons in the Christ Church Yard list. Where are the other bodies buried? The charge of "six shillings" covers only one burial, whereas four were given a permit. Is this a reinterment, or is there some other reason for this action?

West, since the inscriptions are almost identical]; Mary Wilson (May 20, 1807); Henry Zimmerman (November 16, 1806). Fourteen stones are unreadable or broken; therefore, the missing inscriptions may once have been located on these stones.

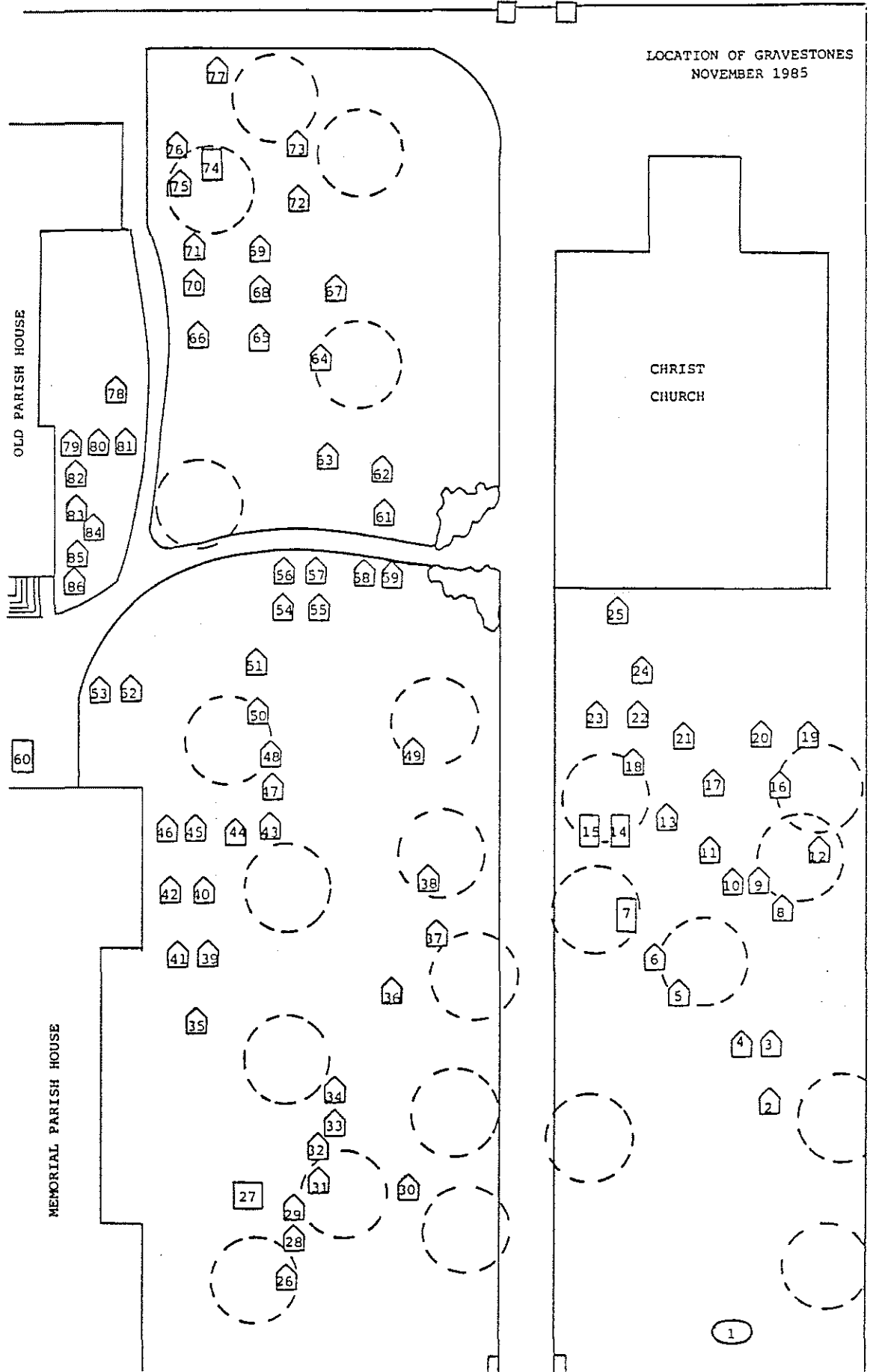

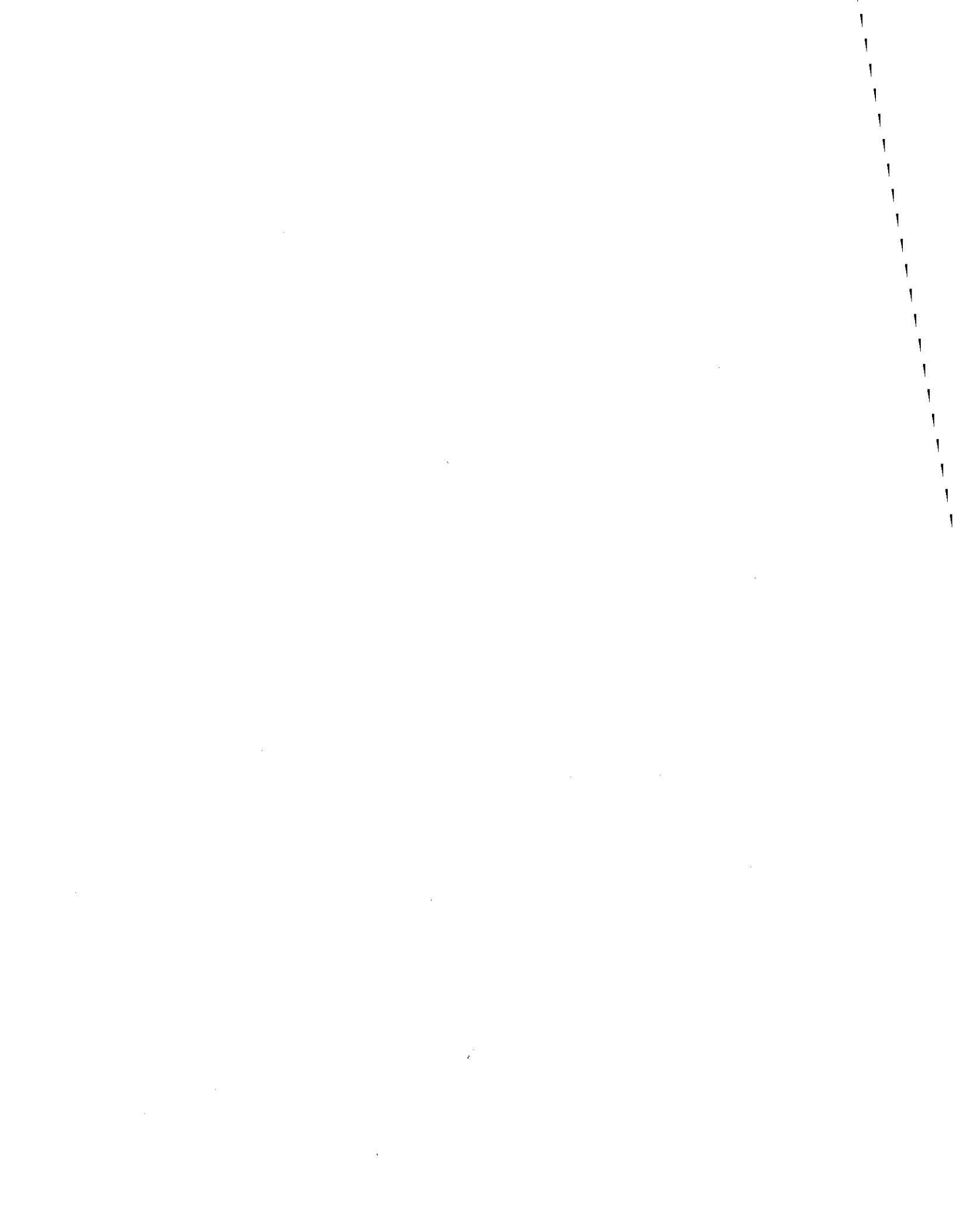

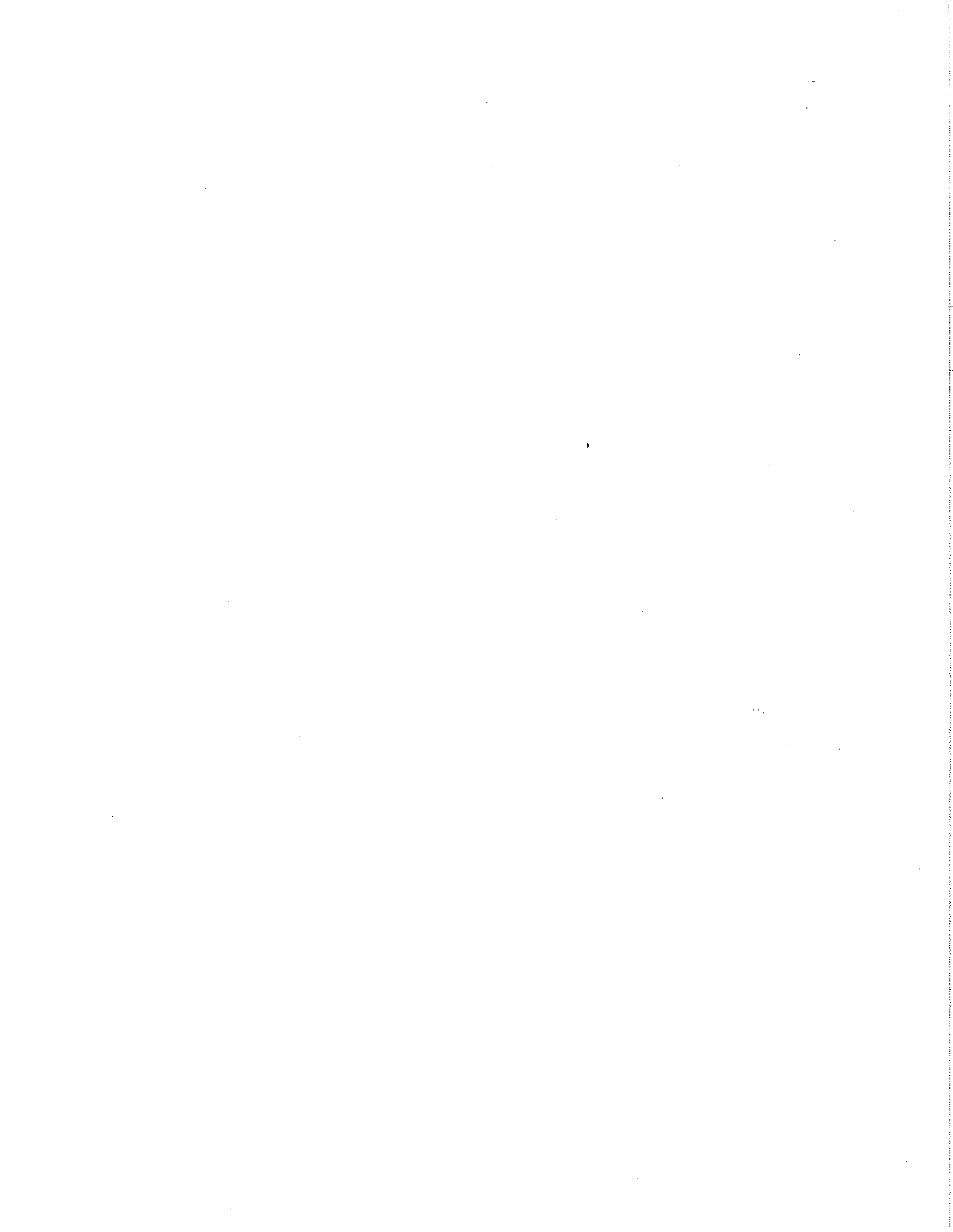

"1788 Resolved that the sum of six shillings be paid for every grave hereafter to be dug in the protestant Episcopal Church burying ground in Alexandria, provided that any poor person may with the leave of one of the Church wardens or in their absence a member of the Vestry in writing under their hand bury their dead therein gratis -

The money arising from the resources to be applied to keeping the burying ground in repair and that the surplus in any to go into the general funds of the Church."

1788-1789, Page 110

"Resolved that the Sexton shall dig no grave until permission is first obtained in writing from the Church Warden or in his absence a Vestryman. The Sexton shall make report to the clerk of every grave dug by him and lodge with the clerk the written order."
