#### B. Intern Exchange and Teen Exchange

Gabi Friedman reported on the 2019 'Beaujolais Nouveau' event which was held at Lloyd House with presentations from several vendors, wine-tastings, a DJ and photo-booth. This event was completely sold out and a great overall success.
