CALL TO ORDER

Vanice called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm.

The virtual meeting notice was read by Nicole Quinn.

There was no quorum present, so the meeting could not conduct any official business. The new member, Lovie Patish, introduced herself to the members in attendance. Vanice noted that the minutes were distributed, but could not be voted on until next month.

Vanice reported on revenues raised from GWBCC activities, and payment of some of the outstanding debts, including Brian Hilton. There remains a balance of approximately \$1401.39. Vanice also shared the required notice and City presence required for subgroup meetings.

He also solicited feedback on events that any members attended. Bennett and Vanice both committed to submitting reports on events attended. He reminded the committee that members are required to report volunteer hours, and requests that a monthly tally be emailed to him and Nicole Quinn.

Sue Johnson reported on Eventbrite registration numbers for various GWBCC events, approximately 150 people in total. 55-60 participated in the churchyard tours. The registrants and their contact information are now captured on an excel spreadsheet for future use.
