# Pretend: Fire Ladder Rescue

#### **Materials From Home**

- Spray bottle filled with water
- Masking tape, painter's tape, or sidewalk chalk
- Stuffed animals or other toys




#### Instructions


- 1. Using tape (indoors) or sidewalk chalk (outdoors) create a fire ladder outline on a floor, sidewalk, or driveway. Have your child help!
- 2. Using chalk, draw flames on a piece of paper (indoors) and place at the top of the ladder. Outdoors, use sidewalk chalk to draw flames at the top of the ladder.
- 3. Have your child place a few favorite toys on the ground at the top of the ladder above the flames. Place the spray bottle at the top of the ladder.
- 4. Put on your fire helmet and let's go! Use the Fire Ladder Rescue cards to make different patterns with your feet in the ladder as you move towards the top.
- 5. When you reach the top, pick up your "fire extinguisher" (spray bottle) and spray the chalk flames with water. *Tip: If you don't have a spray bottle or have a younger child who can't use one, have them squeeze a wet sponge over the flames!* When the fire's out, rescue an animal. Jump back down the ladder.
- 6. Repeat until all the animals have been rescued. Great job firefighter!




### **Fire Ladder** Rescue: **Lateral Bear Crawl**
