Student Assignment History

- ▶ 1965–1971 Alexandria City School Board implemented its desegregation plan
- ▶ 1971 Alexandria's three 4-year high schools merged into one senior high school (11–12) and 2 junior high schools (9–10)
- ▶ 1973– elementary school pairing plan
- ▶ 1993– 6th graders incorporated into FCH or GW & 9th graders were assigned to Minnie Howard

Student Assignment Cont.

- ▶ June 1999 the School Board voted on its “Re-Districting Plan”
- ▶ Plan Goals
 - Addressing capacity
 - Minimizing the number of families affected
 - Establishing both K-5 and focus schools
 - Eliminating cross-town busing except as warranted by a family’s choice to attend a focus school

Long Range Educational Facilities Plan

- ▶ 19 member Work Group jointly created by ACPS and City Leadership
- ▶ 15–18 months timeline

Hanover Research Organization

- ▶ In December 2012, the Hanover Research organization, of which ACPS is a subscriber/member, published its latest findings on “Enrollment and Student Assignment Planning Practices.” This report refers to the importance of using a data-informed approach to the work of student assignment and long-range planning. It stresses the importance of community engagement and school division transparency throughout the planning process. As has been noted in numerous other studies on this topic, educational equity, school choice and neighborhood schools are important guiding principles.
- ▶ Student Assignment Subcommittee could provide the venue to study the data and develop and recommend guiding principles.

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Long-Range Educational Facilities Plan

The City of Alexandria and the Alexandria City Public School System (ACPS) are jointly developing a work program for a Long Range Educational Facilities Plan to improve facilities planning, accommodate the growing student population, and enhance educational programs and services.

As part of the program, a 19 member work group was established and is comprised of members from the community, ACPS School Board, City Council, Campagna Center, and the PTA Council, supported by ACPS and City staff. The workgroup meets on a regular basis, generally quarterly, to explore the major issues that will impact public school facilities over the long term and to guide staff in the development of a draft Long Range Educational Facilities Plan for consideration by the School Board and City Council.

The public is invited to all meetings of the work group and is encouraged to stay informed about upcoming meetings through eNews.
