Updates on Fort Ward Management Plan Implementation As of March 1, 2017

- 1. <u>Interpretive Plan</u> Staff is evaluating the proposals from consultants that have been submitted. A consultant selection will be made in March. The next meeting of the Interpretive Plan Committee is scheduled for March 09, 2017.
- <u>The Fort Ward Ceremonial Gate</u> an authentic reconstruction of the historic Union fort's original entrance gate will be undergoing some preservation work in the spring to repair deteriorated areas. This preservation project is being funded by The Friends of Fort Ward.
- Oral History The final Memorandum of Understanding between the City and Fort Ward and Seminary African American Descendants Society has been executed. Now, the Descendent Society can move forward with recording oral histories and learning more about the Fort Ward community.
- Former Maintenance Yard Area \$186,000 in FY2017 Capital Funds are available to restore this area. Archaeology work related to this project is still planned to begin in the Maintenance Yard area this spring to identify any cultural resources.
- <u>ADA Compliant Access</u> \$89,000 in FY2017 Capital Funds are available to provide ADA compliant access paths between the parking and the picnic shelter, and to improve the loop road for ADA compliant pedestrian use. This project is in planning phase. The design work is expected to begin in spring with construction anticipated in fall, 2017. Work will be coordinated between RPCA and OHA staff.
- <u>Tree Planting</u> 20 trees were planted late this fall before the end of the year using City's Capital Funds. In addition, Trees Alexandria led by Bonnie Petry plan to plant about 20 additional trees in the park this spring.
- Proposed FY2018 -2027 Capital Improvement Program On 2/21/2017, City Manager presented his proposed FY2018 Operating Budget and FY2018-2027 Capital Budget (CIP) to the City Council. The proposed CIP includes continued funding for the implementation of the Fort Ward Management Plan thru FY2027 (see attached).

PROJECT DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

The Fort Ward Park and Museum Management Plan includes five goal areas and associated recommendations to improve park management/operations (between departments); protect historic and cultural resources currently unmarked/protected; coordinate park improvements with the stormwater master plan; develop historic and cultural interpretation throughout the park; and replace and care for trees. Improvements will be phased over several years to keep the park open to the public while changes are implemented. Priorities for implementing the recommendations of the plan were developed by the Advisory Group, staff and with feedback from the general public. The phased funding proposed reflects those priorities. These priorities and the budgeted amounts may be revised in future years based on feedback from the public and the operational needs of Fort Ward.

- Phase I soft interpretive trail installation (\$150,000)
- Mark and develop eastern park entrance from North Van Dorn (\$50,000)
