Breakout Session Exercise Report-Out Presentations in the Order Presented

Group #3

- Agrees with Alternative C: All agree that Alternative C is at the appropriate scale and character but according to one member of the group it looks a little busy.
- **Founders Park:** Likes the edges, naturalized shoreline, north and south gardens, boulder steps, and shaded spaces.
- Oronoco Bay Park: Likes the edges, seating, additional paths and Ralphs Gutt.
- **Rivergate Park:** Likes seating, boulder steps and boat ramp.
- **Tidelock Park:** Bridge should be handicapped accessible; however, overall, likes the character of the bridge.
- Connectivity, Shade and Activity, Common Elements and Art Agrees with all that is proposed; agrees with the historic character but would like to see some more maritime heritage art.

Group #1

- Gave an unsure relative Option C: overall a good plan but worried about some elements of it:
 - Notation of support for the Alexandria Seaport Foundation with request to include it in the design.
 - Concerned about parking.
 - Does not like the ice skating rink; there may be a place for it but not at the foot of King Street.
 - o Debris in Oronoco Bay Park how can that be addressed?
 - o Oronoco Bay is shallow which will limit kayaking.
 - o Concerned about underground ecological issues.
 - o Be sure that the number and height of trees don't block views of the water. Trees are great, but views are also great.
 - Ok with the connectivity shown in the plan.
 - Lighting, furnishing, art need more information.

Group #2

- Alternative C believes the design successfully captures what people want. The scale is right.
- Founders Park –Seating, stepping stones, and shaded space are positive; scale is right.
 Important to see what will occur at RTN as it may impact the design.
- o **Oronoco Bay Park** Stakeholders of the residential areas of Old Town North should be consulted more. For example, for some residents, trees may be an issue (some may want

Group #2 (Continued)

- o more shade and some may want the open views). Thinks Wythe Street Park should be opened up more.
- o **Rivergate Park** Put water in the Canal; this canal was beautiful when it was first built but has declined over past 20 years with lack of clean water, etc.
- o **Tidelock Park** Make an agreement with local buildings to help assist with parking for the kayakers.
- o **Shade, Connectivity, Common Elements** the plan proportions are right but some of the common elements may need to be varied along different areas of the Waterfront.

Group #4

• Alternative C

- o It captures the best elements of A and B.
- o It is generally at the appropriate scale.
- Question at Thompson Alley thinks the size of the service area may be too large; also concerned about the amount of hardscape near the Chart House; thinks more green area is needed.
- o Likes the pedestrian flow along the walkway.

Founders Park

- o Scale:
 - Is the Pendleton side realistic? Green street ends look good on Oronoco and Pendleton Streets but may be in conflict with service/loading and unloading needs for RTN.
 - Noted the importance of including the public in discussions about governance and maintenance.

Oronoco Bay Park

- Existing piling can they stay?
- o Bay has debris issues that should be addressed.
- o Naturalized shorelines may be a way to use the tides to help with cleaning.
- Wythe Street good.
- o Notation of no regrading.

• Rivergate Park

- Scale is ok.
- Non-motorized boat launch question as to whether its location may be too close to the rowing facility.
- Parking parking would be needed if kayak launch is included, because nearby parking is too far away.

• Design Comments:

- Flex space is needed.
- o Maybe not enough programming.
- o Solicit input to ensure needs of children and tots are accommodated.
- o More passive uses needed.

• Connectivity is good.

- Common Elements are good so far.
- Concepts for site art are good so far; more information needed.

Group #5

• Option C – Successfully captures the best elements of A and B.

• Option C Scale

- o An option is needed that includes the reality that the ODBC lot may not be acquired.
- Variety of open space is good.
- o On the ground, will you have the sight lines through the vegetation?
- o Likes the rooms, the corridors and water edges.
- Need design guidance for RTS concrete piers and how they fit in with the public space. Work with the developers on the piers.
- o Concern about a maintainable river's edge dealing with the sludge, driftwood and trash.
- o A comment was made that the promenade may be too massive in some areas.
- o Where is the sustainable area per the Chesapeake Bay Act?
- Likes the smaller rooms.
- o Be careful about the scale of the Civic building use elevations showing the building looking back towards town so as not to obstruct views on the city side.
- Pedestrians and cyclists should be separated for the most part.
- Make a choice of whether you want vehicular or pedestrian traffic in the core area.
- Make sure that the riverfront façade and edges of the private developments complement the plan's design.
- Compatibility of materials is good.

Founders Park

• Likes thinning out of the tree area.

Windmill Hill Park

• Windmill Hill Park is missing . . . do not leave it disconnected in terms of the continuous path and materials. It should be complimentary to the rest of the Waterfront.

Oronoco Bay Park

- Trees look big. Shouldn't block the view of fireworks and performances.
- Subterranean issues make the lower lawn very soggy and should be addressed.
- Crab like arm is problematic in terms of debris.
- Rocks may be an issue for children slipping. Make it child proof.
- Likes Ralph's Gutt.

Tidelock Park

• Find a way to draw people down Montgomery to better connect this area with the rest of the Waterfront.

Other

- Beachcombers could be a restaurant but also look at an alternative that might use it to commemorate the history of the Waterfront.
- No support for ice skating rink.
- West's Point is good and should be used to amplify the City's history.
- Parking has already been spoken to.
- Awnings should look good from above and at ground level.
- Blackwall Hitch's façade is dark . .. make sure it does not look overbearing.
- Make the Waterfront operational/functional throughout . . . such as including water fountains in spaces.

Group #6

- Option C-5 stated it captures best elements of A and B, with comments:
 - Not comfortable with Fitzgerald Square.
 - 3 out of 5 opposed the skating rink.
- **Option C Scale** 5 support the scale
 - o Likes King Street extending to the water.
- Founders Park
 - o 5 supports likes path and shoreline improvements.
- Oronoco Bay Park
 - o 5 supports with wider opening to the water.
- Rivergate Park
 - o 5 supports likes rational path; concern with debris in water
- Tidelock Park
 - o 5 supports
 - **Balance of sun and shade** 5 supports.
- **Connectivity** 5 supports. Walkways must be porous.
- **Lighting and Furnishings** 5 supports basic concept but needs more detail.
- Art 5 supports Likes interpretive pavers; would like interactive art and sculpture.

Group #7

- Option C Yes; believes it successfully addresses the best elements of A and B.
- Option C Scale:
 - o Likes small gardens.
 - o Likes street end gardens.
 - o Provides good buffering for neighbors.
 - o Ice skating rink is still a concern for some.

Founders Park

- o Agrees with the improvements proposed.
- o The focus on the river is good.
- o Boulder seating and steps are good.
- o #60 should be opened up or replanted more appropriately.
- o Transition of park to street near West's Point
- Tidelock Park
 - Use some old stones in Rivergate and/or Tidelock as seating.
- Oronoco Bay Park no time to discuss but no disagreement.
- Rivergate Park
 - o Likes seat orientation pointing north.
 - Parking lot and kayak launch may be too close to homes. Street may be too narrow for loading and unloading of kayaks.
- Likes the path in general; use old canal stones in parks as seating.
- **General agreement with other elements**, recognizing that more information is to come regarding lighting, furnishing etc.

Group #8

- Alternative C Yes; likes diagonal.
- **Alternative C Scale** –Comfortable with the scale; concerned about shade structures at the Torpedo Factory. Keep the area open for the tents and art.
- **Founders Park** Generally agrees with improvements and scale. Concerned that trees may block homeowners' views of the river.
- Oronoco Bay Park 3 agree and 1 disagrees.
 - o Trees block views; others like the shade. Needs wayfinding.
 - Concern about debris.

• Rivergate/Tidelock

- o Fix water in the canal.
- o Parking issues.
- Boat launch is ok.
- Likes incorporation of art into the form.
- Likes the **path**.

Groups #9 and #10 (combined)

- Alternative C Likes C's design and scale.
 - Likes having flexible, multipurpose, hardscape space at foot of King Street (6 agreed).
 - Ice skating rink (5 in favor and 1 opposed; 1 abstained) provides a winter recreational activity that we do not have now.
 - o Questions relating to ODBC parking lot.
 - Need to enforce existing parking regulations.
 - o Likes the way the diagonal is tweaked in C.
- Alternative C Scale Likes the scale and character (6 votes)
 - o Maintenance and sustainability are important.
- Founders Park
 - o Likes that the rip rap is addressed. Likes walking areas.
- Oronoco Bay Park
 - Likes the Box Car Theatre as a small space.
 - o Likes the regarding.
 - o Likes Ralph's Gutt.
 - o Likes pathways.
- Connectivity, Common Elements and Art Likes in general but acknowledges that more information about the common elements and art will be forthcoming at a later time.
